



Job Title: Fuel Handler
Reports to: Operations & Maintenance Manager
Location: Cadillac, MI

Job Responsibilities:

The Fuel Handler is responsible for the safe and efficient management of the fuel supply of a biomass plant, power plant auxiliary equipment and fuel handling equipment. Specific responsibilities and duties include but are not limited to:

- Maintains fuel in the storage area, including the receipt, handling and storage of fuel in a safe and efficient manner.
- Ensures fuel samples are taken and documented as required.
- Performs preventative maintenance on the dozers, plant fuel handling system and storage area as assigned, including cleaning, greasing, filter changes, etc.
- Safety operates heavy equipment.
- Ensure a consistent fuel supply to plant from conveyor system
- Increases knowledge heat recovery steam generators, steam turbine, electrical generators, air compressors, motors, pumps, compressors, electrical switchgear, loaders, ash and fuel handling systems dozer and small utility equipment used to generate power,

Education:

High school diploma or equivalent

Requirements:

- 2-4 years' experience operating heavy equipment is preferred
- Valid state driver's license
- Ability to read and interpret documentation such as technical manuals, operating and maintenance manuals, and operations procedures.
- Ability to write routine correspondence and reports.
- Ability to communicate effectively with coworkers and contractors.
- Basic computer skills and familiarity with Microsoft Office products
- Willingness to work a continental shift rotation with routine overtime.
- Additional trade skills would be considered an asset.
- Demonstrated commitment to safety.
- Must be able to work both independently with minimal supervision, and also at times as part of a broader team environment.

Physical Requirements

- Ability to hear and use close range radios
- Ability to lift, push, pull, and carry items up to 50 lbs.

- Ability to reach with hands and arms above shoulder level and at shoulder level
- Ability to walk, stand, stoop, kneel, and bend for prolonged periods of time
- Ability to grip and manually manipulate, often with repetitive motion, items such as, but not limited to, hand tools and machine parts
- Possess a strong field of vision including visual depth perception and ability to distinguish colors
- Ability to climb ladders up to 75' high and stairs to perform assigned tasks.
- Ability to raise or lower objects from one level to another regularly during the shift
- Comfortable working in confined spaces and at heights of over 100'
- Ability to work in demanding physical and inclement weather conditions
